IN CASE YOU'RE THINKING AHEAD TO HALLOWEEN

NOTICE OF REQUEST FOR PTA FUNDING

At the October 3rd PTA, a proposal was brought forward to provide \$1700 funding for the BCS Library to purchase books for the Birbery 2019-2020 reading program. The PTA has provided support for the program in the past. The library is requesting additional funding this year as a result of district-wide budget cuts. The funding would come out of the PTA's Unplanned Expense budget. Without the support of the PTA, the library will either not able to provide the books for students to participate in this program at the same rate as in previous years or will need to make cuts in other areas. A vote on this proposal will be held at the November 7th PTA meeting. Thank you for your consideration.

About the Birbery Program

The Birbery is a districtwide reading program for 6th-8th grade students in which the students are invited to read up to 10 highly praised, acclaimed books published within the calendar year that are potential Newbery Award contenders. Those students who read all ten books participate in our school's Quiz Bowl competition; those who read five or more attend as spectators and enjoy the celebration centered around the program. The five winners of the Quiz Bowl go on to Baldwin Library (via limo), where Baldwin librarians host the committee made up of 15 middle school students. The true goal of the Birbery program is to get middle school students reading, and BCS has been successful accomplishing this goal in the past. All ten books in the 2018-19 program together circulated 641 times during the school year. While only a percentage of middle school students participate in the Quiz Bowl aspect of the program, the high-quality of the books and the excitement of the program make them a popular choice among 6th-8th graders during and even after the Birbery program dates.

BCS grade 5 and new grade 6-8 students and parents will receive log in directions in the next few weeks, and grades 3/4 parents will receive log in directions toward the end of the first quarter in order to view report cards that will be available online.

4th and 5th Grade BATTLE OF THE BOOKS

GROWING UP 2020 CONFERENCE

Growing Up 2020 (formerly known as Surviving the Social Jungle) is taking place for the first time in **Northville**, **Saturday**, **November 9**, and will include three simultaneous, and distinctly different, tracks:

- 1. for kids 3rd-6th grade (7 fun stations; hands-on, small groups),
- 2. teens 7th-12th (2 interactive sessions; self-defense separated by gender),
- 3. and the adults who care about them (keynote plus 2 workshops selected from 12 options). Professional Development credits will be available.

1. Adults will hear a powerful keynote with national speaker, educator, author, <u>Katey McPherson</u>, and then attend 2 workshop sessions, during which they can choose from 6 concurrent breakouts. (12 options total). The presenters and topics are diverse, and extremely timely. There's something for everyone.

- 2. While adults are sharpening their saws, kids will participate in 7 hands-on activity stations where different skills are learned.
- 3. The teen track is designed with the unique needs of teen girls and teen boys in mind, including separate self-defense sessions.

Participating youth receive a string backpack, reusable water bottle, nut-free snack, and station take-aways to remind them of the lessons learned, and participation in a performance from special guest, singer/songwriter, <u>Ali McManus</u>.
