Groves Family Update- August 12, 2019

Summer has been a busy time for the Groves' staff. In addition to using this time to relax and rejuvenate, many of our staff members have attended workshops, read educational books, and aided in the planning of the upcoming year. Our teachers are excited about the 2019-20 school year, and we hope you are too!

We would like to thank the families who have completed their registration forms online. The window opened on Thursday, August 1 and **must be completed before in-person Student Registration in late August**.

Registration Process

There are two steps to the registration process. The first step is to participate in the Online Registration Process. The second step is to have your student attend the in-school Student Registration process on the designated dates (see schedule under in-school Student Registration)

Online Registration Process

All families must register online before attending the in-person Student Registration. The online registration process opened on August 1. Please see the attached instructions titled "Returning Student Registration Process."

In-School Student Registration Process

The final step of the registration process is in-person Student Registration in the Groves High School cafeteria. In-person Student Registration is scheduled as follows:

Freshman Registration	August 22, 2019 8:00-10:00 a.m.
Sophomore Registration	August 22, 2019 12:00-2:00 p.m.
Seniors Registration	August 23, 2019 8:00-10:00 a.m.
Juniors Registration	August 23, 2019 12:00-2:00 p.m.

Students will take a picture for their student ID, and receive their locker assignment, textbooks, and parking pass (eligible junior and senior students).

A hardcopy of all forms that require a parent signature should be brought to the in-school Student Registration. These forms include, but are not limited to: Permission to Administer Medication, Athletic Pass, Open Lunch form (Juniors and Seniors only), Parking Pass (Juniors and Seniors only)

Students will not be able to complete their in-person school registration at Groves if their parent has not completed the online portion. Students will show that they have completed their online registration by also bringing a hardcopy or an electronic copy of their confirmation email. Due to a technical error, confirmation emails were not generated until August 6. If you have completed the form and did not receive an email, please log in and print a copy of the forms to show at inperson registration so that we can verify the completion of the forms.

Fines and Book Returns

All fines and book returns need to be cleared in order to participate in the in-person registration. Please check your email for fines and book notifications.

e-Funds

In order to pay any fees, you may use the link for *e-Funds for Schools*. This program offers various options for parents/guardians who choose to make payments online or from their mobile devices. Users will have the ability to have various school fees/payments electronically withdrawn from a checking account or charged to a credit card. You have the flexibility to make a payment at any time through the school's website, and you will receive an email confirmation for every payment that is processed.

How does e-Funds for Schools work?

This is a separate program from the online registration system and will require a separate login and password. You will need your student(s) Student ID Number(s) to link your Student's name and fee options.

Will there be any fees associated with using e-Funds?

For the convenience of paying online there is a small convenience fee associated with each payment: \$1.00 for using your checking/savings account information (direct ACH), and \$2.65 (per \$100) for using your credit/debit card.

The following are just some of the items may be purchased online using e-Funds: Athletic Pass/Family Athletic Pass, Yearbook/School Newspaper, Spirit Week Dues, Fines

You may still pay for any items with a personal check or cash at the school when you attend your scheduled registration date/time.
