

Homework/Class work

You will have homework every single school day. You will have very few written assignments, but you will be required to spend time studying for your weekly quiz, usually over vocabulary or grammar.

Some class work will count for credit. If you are absent, you must make up these assignments.

Tests

You will receive ample notice (usually one week) before tests, so it is important to be prepared.

Quizzes

Every week you will have a vocabulary or grammar quiz. You will receive the list of words or the grammar topic one week in advance. I recommend you spend at least ten to fifteen minutes reviewing per day.

Participation/ Effort

In order to really learn a language you must use it. Participating often in class will increase your understanding and proficiency. Participation can be in small groups, in an individual activity or in whole-class activities.

I will give you the tools you need to be successful, but it is up to you to pick them up and use them.

Absent Policy

If you are absent, you have one class day (for each class day missed) to make up the work you missed. Check Profe's blog to find missed assignments. If you need a handout or worksheet, Ms. Snyder will give it to you when you return to class.

You are responsible to schedule a convenient time to take a missed quiz or test. If you are absent the day before a regularly scheduled quiz or test, you are still expected to take the test on its scheduled day. You will know about them ahead of time, so this should not be a problem.

Late Policy

You are expected to turn in all homework assignments (and projects). Only work that is turned in on time will receive full credit. Work that is one week late will not receive credit.
